

Terms & Conditions

Welcome to EchoBraid. These Terms & Conditions ("Terms") govern your access to and use of the EchoBraid website, applications, and related services (collectively, the "Service"). By using EchoBraid, you agree to these Terms. If you do not agree, please do not use the Service.^[1]

1. Who we are

EchoBraid is a neurodivergent-affirming learning space that provides curriculum, tools, and software to support ASD and other neurodivergent learners, as well as their families and educators.^{[3][1]}

Our design is guided by the principles of sovereignty, safety, low-stimulus interfaces, and user-controlled memory.^{[2][1]}

2. Eligibility and accounts

- You must be at least the age of legal consent in your jurisdiction, or have consent and supervision from a parent, guardian, or institution, to create an account or administer learner profiles.^[1]
- Children under 13 may only use EchoBraid under adult-managed accounts (for example, a parent or school) in accordance with applicable child-privacy laws.^[1]
- You are responsible for maintaining the confidentiality of your login credentials and for all activities that occur under your account.

We reserve the right to suspend or terminate accounts that violate these Terms or endanger others.

3. Non-clinical, educational use only

EchoBraid is an educational and support platform, not a medical, psychological, or crisis service.^{[4][1]}

- EchoBraid does not provide diagnosis, treatment, or medical advice.
- Nothing in the Service should be used as a substitute for professional care from licensed clinicians.

- If you or someone else may be in crisis or at risk of harm, contact local emergency services or a crisis hotline immediately; do not rely on EchoBraid.^[4]

4. Acceptable use

EchoBraid is built to be a safe space for neurodivergent learners. You agree not to:

- Use the Service in ways that violate any applicable law or regulation.
- Harass, bully, threaten, or exploit other users or learners.
- Upload or share content that is hateful, abusive, sexually explicit involving minors, or otherwise inappropriate in an educational setting.
- Attempt to access accounts, data, or systems you do not have permission to access.
- Reverse-engineer, interfere with, or disrupt the Service, including attempting to bypass safety or consent mechanisms.^{[2][4]}

We may remove content or suspend access where we reasonably believe these rules have been violated.

5. Content and intellectual property

5.1 Our content

Unless otherwise indicated, the Service and its original content—including curriculum materials, text, graphics, user interface elements, and software—are owned by EchoBraid or our licensors and are protected by copyright and other laws.^{[3][1]}

Subject to these Terms, we grant you a limited, non-exclusive, non-transferable license to access and use the Service and its content for personal, family, classroom, or institutional educational purposes.^{[5][3]}

You may not:

- Resell, sublicense, or commercially exploit the Service or its content, except under a separate written agreement.
- Remove or alter any proprietary notices or license information.

Some materials may be published under open licenses (for example, MIT / CC BY-NC-SA) as indicated; those materials are governed by their specific license terms in addition to these Terms.^{[5][3]}

5.2 Your content

You retain ownership of the content you create or upload to EchoBraid (for example, journals, lesson plans, or learner tools).^{[3][1]}

By submitting content, you grant EchoBraid a limited license to store, process, and display that content as needed to provide the Service to you and, where applicable, to your learners or institution.^[1]

You are responsible for ensuring that you have the right to upload and share any content you provide.

6. Privacy and data practices

Your use of the Service is also governed by our Privacy Policy, which explains what information we collect, how we use it, and your choices.^{[2][1]}

Key points include:

- Default mode is “nothing saved” for demos; other storage modes are clearly labeled (erase after 24 hours, local-only, export).^[1]
- No cross-site tracking or behavioral advertising.^[1]
- User-controlled memory and data minimization are core design commitments.^{[3][2]}

7. Institutional and school use

EchoBraid is provided on an “as is” and “as available” basis. We strive for a stable, low-stimulus experience, but we do not guarantee uninterrupted service, absence of errors, or permanent availability of any particular feature or content.^[1]

We may update, suspend, or discontinue parts of the Service (including specific curriculum items or tools) at any time, for example to improve safety, comply with law, or address technical issues.^{[2][1]}

10. Disclaimers

To the maximum extent permitted by law:

- EchoBraid disclaims all warranties, express or implied, including implied warranties of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, and non-infringement.
- We do not warrant that the Service will meet your specific requirements, be error-free, or achieve particular learning or therapeutic outcomes.^{[5][2]}

Any educational or well-being benefits described in our materials are goals, not guarantees.

11. Limitation of liability

To the maximum extent permitted by law, EchoBraid and its founders, employees, partners, and licensors are not liable for any indirect, incidental, special, consequential, or punitive damages, or any loss of profits, data, or goodwill, arising out of or related to your use of the Service.^{[4][2]}

Where liability cannot be excluded, it will be limited to the amount you paid for the Service in the preceding 12 months (if any). If you use only the free tier, your sole remedy is to stop using the Service.
